What's it Like?

From the minute you enter the water you escape into another world. Once you are certified as an Open Water diver, every dive you make you will always see and experience something different.

Take your leap of faith: Get the urge to submerge!

At Go Deep Scuba we love diving and you'll find our friendly staff are committed to your safety and enjoyment.

It is natural for fish to breathe underwater, but it can be a strange and exciting feeling for us. To discover how it feels to blow bubbles, come along and sign up for an introductory course. You can take your first steps under the guidance of our professional instructors. For a small investment of \$30.00 and two hours of your time, you can participate in our SSI Try Scuba program.

So Where to From Here?

So you've decided diving is fun and that you want to add some excitement and adventure to your life. To take you next step, sign onto our Open Water course. Our instructors will take you through the skills in the water, but at no time will we compromise your safety.

The course has both classroom and pool training and we use up to date video and audio-visual equipment to enhance your learning experience. The pool sessions are where you learn the skills that will be needed for you to dive in the open water environment. Once you have completed your assessments and open water dives, you will be certified as an Open Water diver and you will have a diving qualification that is recognized throughout the world.

How Long is the Course?

This depends on you and your schedule and will also be determined by how quickly you can get through the theory section of your learning. Whether you prefer to train during the week, in the evenings or during the weekends, we can accommodate you. We try to remain flexible, work around your timetable and then join together a group that have similar schedules or time constraints.

What do you need?

You'll need to have your GP confirm you are medically fit to dive. Some medical conditions are affected by breathing compressed air and could put you at undue risk, so a medical clearance from your usual GP is required. Go Deep Scuba will provide a medical declaration form in your enrolment pack. You will need to pay the course fee.

What Do I Get for My Course Fee?

For a great price you will get a full Open Water course that includes manuals, pool sessions, open water dives, travel from Go Deep Scuba to the open water dive sites and all equipment to use whilst on course. On completion of the course you will receive a course certificate and an Open Water Diver certification card.

Any accommodation and food costs are not covered by the course fees. We may travel to the designated dive site and stay overnight to complete dive training over a weekend. We try to keep the costs of accommodation to a minimum and advise you before time of any costs that you may need to cover.

Life After Open Water

A lot of folk are happy to stay at Open Water diver, hunting for crays, taking photos, or just watching and admiring the underwater world at its best.

Some though want to continue their dive education and work their way up the dive ladder. Courses such as Advanced Open Water and Specialty Diver can include new experiences and adventures like wreck diving, deep diving, night diving or even underwater photography. Why not strive to gain the highest non professional rating and become a Master Diver?

Maybe you would like to work in the dive industry and the first rating you will need to achieve is SSI Dive Control Specialist. This is an exciting course which takes your knowledge and diving to the next level. If you are already a Divecon/Divemaster we can take you through to SSI Open Water Instructor.
